FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE:

PJ Day for the Kids



Thank you to the T.I.S. Community for the outstanding participation displayed during PJ Day for the Kids. This year's PJ Day was even more meaningful for us than usual as one of our students is currently undergoing treatment for cancer. As a school community we proudly support our friend.

Winter Weather

It is important that students come to school dressed appropriately for cold weather. Because temperatures can fluctuate drastically during the day, appropriate cold weather clothing should be worn as a means of protection. Students will go outside for recess unless it is raining, or if the temperature and wind chill combine for a temperature less than 20 degrees. Any student not dressed in long pants and in possession of a coat or heavy sweatshirt, on days in which the temperature or wind chill falls below freezing will be kept inside for that day's recess period.

Reflex Math Fact Fluency

Throughout the school year students are engaged in continued enhancement of their math facts. One way this is accomplished is through use of an online, game-based program called Reflex. Reflex helps students master their basic addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts. Your child has been using the Reflex program here in school and in the case of some classes, at home as well.

Since Reflex is an online program, your child has the opportunity to continue using the program at home from any device with internet access. To access Reflex, please follow the steps below or download the Reflex Student app for iPad users.

- Go to https://www.reflexmath.com
- Click "Login" in the upper right hand corner
- Students should login with the username and student password listed below

Each session in Reflex takes approximately 15 minutes. Students are encouraged to login to Reflex at least 3 times per week at home or at school and get a Green Light. "Getting the Green Light is how students can gain improved math fact fluency as quickly and efficiently as possible! The Green Light—located in the upper right corner of the screen—illuminates once a student answers a certain number of facts correctly on a given day. This marks the completion of a good day's math fact fluency practice. During each Reflex session, Green Light progress is measured by a ring around the indicator light in the upper right of the screen. As a student advances through their session, the ring will fill in green. Once the ring is full, the indicator light will turn green. This means the student has reached the Green Light. They can now log out, or if time allows, spend their tokens at the Reflex store. Although the Green Light depends on students correctly answering facts, not time used, students can typically get the Green Light in 15 minutes of concentrated use. For best results, students should get the Green Light at least

December Reading Thoughts From the Reading Department

Dear Parents,
The following passage will explain why it is so critical for your student to be reading at home each evening. We hope it will encourage you to read to and with your child daily. It is important that they have practice with reading out loud and silently as well.

Practice makes Permanent!!!

Why Your Child Should Read for 20 minutes Every Day

"WHY CAN'T I SKIP MY 20 MINUTES OF READING TONIGHT?"

LET'S FIGURE IT OUT --- MATHEMATICALLY!

Student A reads 20 minutes five night of every week; Student B reads only 4 minutes a night...or not at all! Step 1: Multiply minutes a night x 5 times each week.

Student A reads 20 minutes x 5 times a week = 100 min. /week

Student B reads 4 minutes x 5 times a week = 20 minutes

Step 2: Multiply minutes a week x 4 weeks each month.

Student A reads 400 minutes a month.

Student B reads 80 minutes a month.

Step 3: Multiply minutes a month x 9 months/school year

Student A reads 3600 min. in a school year.

Student B reads 720 min. in a school year.

Student A practices reading the equivalent of ten (10) whole school days a year.

Student B gets the equivalent of only two (2) school days of reading practice.

By the end of 6<sup>th</sup> grade if Student A and Student B maintain these same reading habits, Student A will read the equivalent of 60 whole school days. Student B will have read the equivalent of only 12 school days.

One would expect the gap of information retained will have widened considerably and so, undoubtedly, will school performance. How do you think Student B will feel about him/herself as a student?

Some questions to ponder:

Which student would you expect to read better?

Which student would you expect to know more?

Which student would you expect to write better?

Which student would you expect to have a better vocabulary?

Which student would you expect to be more successful in school . . . . and life?

Fall Back with Read Alouds!

The fall is a great time to get back into curling up *indoors* with some pumpkin spice and a good book. Reading aloud to your children not only helps to *strengthen your children's listening, thinking and verbal skills*; it also helps to create warm childhood memories and some face to face family bonding *away from the glaring blue light of a screen.* And while you're at it......Why not "spice it up" by....oh.....let's seebecoming your child's personal fluency model? "How, pray tell, do I do that, you ask? Just make your reading sound like talking. Ham it up a little! Add some expression! Put emphasis on different words to show meaning. Ask them what they think. Give the characters different voices. Modulate your voice to thrill and engage their attention. Act out a scene!


The joy is in the visualizing! Remind your child to make movies in his/her mind and then talk about what you all saw in the "movie in your mind". **Stop at different intervals** and ask, "What are you thinking?" **Review some wordless picture books a**nd talk about the clues in the pictures.

Read some nonfiction together and explore new places and topics. Don't let the fleeting light and warmth of summer chill *your* bones. Grab a mug of

hot pumpkin apple cider latte, make some great family memories and turn your child into a reader who ultimately prefers the book to the movie and your living room to whatever setting lies beyond........


The most important thing is to read. The more children read and are read to the better reader they will become.



Unified Arts Update for November 2023

Art ~ Library ~ Music ~ Physical Education

Ms. Ballard - Art

Third graders students will begin exploring the **Elements of Art** called **Space and Color.** They will create a **Paper Weaving.** We will be using the Element of **Color** to decorate our fall weavings. Fall pictures will be added to the paper weaving as well as the colored strips of paper. Mrs. Hill - Library/Tech/STEM

Third grade: students will begin fiction genre studies at the intermediate school level. They will be learning about fantasy, mystery, historical fiction, science fiction, realistic fiction and traditional literature. Learning will be through a variety of methods, including: mini-movies from teachertube, powerpoint presentations, hands-on book sorting, genre bingo, Socrative reviews on the computer and interactive SmartBoard lessons. Third grade will also received the guidelines for the *voluntary* Library Book Challenges for this year. The library book challenges are based on reading from all different types of fiction genres.

Fourth grade and Fifth grade: have just finished reviewing nonfiction and students will now be moving on to nonfiction and reviewing the Dewey Decimal System. Fifth grade: just concluded a Library STEM Challenge in October to build a monster trap that did not hurt the monster. The students created some very interesting and innovative traps and demonstrated them to their classmates. Check out this short video clip from one STEM team. I will combine all of the videos taken for each STEM project by class. The iMovies



will then be uploaded to the class Library Google Classroom for viewing.



Fourth grade will show their STEM skills in the Library this month when they are challenged with **how to catch a turkey!**



Ms. Baker - Music & Chorus

<u>Grade 3 general music:</u> Third graders are learning to read and perform rhythms which contain eighth notes, quarter notes, quarter rests, and sixteenth notes, using boomwhackers and non-pitched percussion. Grade 4 Band: Band members have learned how to assemble, disassemble and clean their instruments safely. They are working hard to learn fingerings and proper embouchure (mouth position). It is so exciting to see and hear students enthusiastically learning how to play their instrument! Students have reviewed the values for whole and half notes and whole and half rests. Many Band students are already playing simple melodies such as "Hot Cross Buns" on their



instrument!

It is truly a joy to witness your children on their amazing journey of learning how to play an instrument solo and in small groups!



School Meals 2023-2024:

All students are eligible for a free breakfast each day. Students who qualify for free or *reduced-price meals* will also be eligible to receive one free lunch daily. ALL OTHER LUNCHES WILL BE CHARGED AT THE CURRENT LUNCH PRICE PER SCHOOL.

Payment for these lunches is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The district participates in the National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program which offers students nutritionally balanced meals daily. The lunch period is 30 minutes. Proper manners are always expected in the cafeteria. Free and reducedprice meals are available based on financial need. Information on this program may be obtained from the main office or Abby Kassman-Harned, the Food Service Director, at aharned@tolland.k12.ct.us or 870-6854.

We use a Point-of-Sale System that allows you to put money into an account for your child to purchase meals.

Scanning – All students will be scanned unless the parent or guardian opts out of this biometric identification procedure. When your child comes through the service line, he/she will scan his/her finger as a means of identification.

Payments – The cost of lunch at Birch Grove and Tolland Intermediate school is \$3.15. One school breakfast is free for all students. One milk is provided for each lunch and breakfast. Ala carte milk is \$0.75. You may sign up for "My School Account" and make your payments online. Your child may give payment along with a form to his/her classroom teacher to send to the office, or he/she may bring payment directly to the cashier in the cafeteria at mealtime. Your payment may take us a few days to process. It is important to keep a positive balance in your students' accounts.
