Dress for Winter Weather

It is important that students come to school dressed appropriately for winter weather, just like Mr. McCarthy in the photo to the left. Coats, hats, and long pants should be worn as a means of protection from the winter weather. While some children prefer wearing shorts in the cold weather, not dressing appropriately for cold temperatures puts kids at risk for frostbite and hypothermia. Exposure to temperatures below 32 degrees can result in frostbite faster. Our students will go outside for recess unless it is raining, or if the temperature and wind chill combine for a temperature less than 20 degrees.

Chromebooks

Student Chromebooks are used at various times during the school day. Students have been regularly informed to charge their chromebook each night. Any assistance with reminding your child to charge their device is greatly appreciated.

If your child was given a Chromebook to use while in second grade, we ask that any such device be returned to TIS. Any Chromebook returned to TIS will be delivered back to Birch Grove.

Water Fountains and Student Water Bottles

Our school water fountains are once again operational. Students now have the option to fill their water bottles at a dispenser or to drink from one of our school water fountains. . Students are now able to fill their own water bottles from the dispensers. Students should bring a water bottle to school for their own use. Paper cups will be kept on hand for any student not in possession of a water bottle. The custodial staff will sanitize the dispensers nightly.

Hot Beverages

We continue to experience some spilling issues with students bringing disposable hot beverage cups to school. Please do not send your child to school with hot beverages in disposable cups. Thank you for your cooperation.





Grade 3 During the month of January, we will be starting a **Clay Coil project**. Students will design a base shape and finish the rest of the clay project by coiling up clay, 4 or 5 coils high. The clay project will then need to dry before firing it in the kiln. After the clay project has been fired we will glaze it with two colors of glaze.

Grade 4 The fourth graders will be starting up their Paper Mache Project. Each student will design an armature of the character or animal that they wish to make. The students will make a plan and construct their character with **newspaper** they bought from home. Once the armature is made the students will **paper mache** over the armature making the surface hard and ready for painting. Each child will bring in a printout of the animal or character they were going to make. When the Paper Mache dries the students will paint their sculptures to match their photo.

Grade 5 The fifth graders will be working on finishing their **Marionettes.** Now that we are finished with the Fire Prevention posters, we will return to finish our marionettes. Controllers will be made and clothes will be added. The students will paint areas such as hands and feet, or shoes depending on the character selected. Once the character is finished the marionette can be stung.

This paint does not come out of clothes. All students are asked to wear a smock during class!

Hello Parents! In the art room, students will not be permitted to wear their winter coats in class. Please, send a smock to protect and cover your child's clothes. The art room is used by three different grades and there are messy projects going on all the time. Thank you for your help and understanding. Ms. Ballard

Mrs. Hill - Library Media

During the month of January, all TIS students will complete a **Destiny review**. This review is important to check for mid-year understanding. Destiny is the online card catalog that students use to look up library books. Lessons have been taught about identifying call numbers such as F for fiction. Students will be given time to practice Destiny skills, if needed.

Later in January, all TIS students will complete a Nearpod lesson about the life, work and legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr. The Nearpod lesson has articles to read, videos to watch and interactive questions, polls, and a drawing activity.




FROM OUR SCHOOL NURSE:





School Meals 2023-2024:

All students are eligible for a free breakfast each day. Students who qualify for free or *reduced-price meals* will also be eligible to receive one free lunch daily. ALL OTHER LUNCHES WILL BE CHARGED AT THE CURRENT LUNCH PRICE PER SCHOOL.

Payment for these lunches is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The district participates in the National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program which offers students nutritionally balanced meals daily. The lunch period is 30 minutes. Proper manners are always expected in the cafeteria. Free and reducedprice meals are available based on financial need. Information on this program may be obtained from the main office or Abby Kassman-Harned, the Food Service Director, at aharned@tolland.k12.ct.us or 870-6854.

We use a Point-of-Sale System that allows you to put money into an account for your child to purchase meals.

Scanning – All students will be scanned unless the parent or guardian opts out of this biometric identification procedure. When your child comes through the service line, he/she will scan his/her finger as a means of identification.

Payments – The cost of lunch at Birch Grove and Tolland Intermediate school is \$3.15. One school breakfast is free for all students. One milk is provided for each lunch and breakfast. Ala carte milk is \$0.75. You may sign up for "My School Account" and make your payments online. Your child may give payment along with a form to his/her classroom teacher to send to the office, or he/she may bring payment directly to the cashier in the cafeteria at mealtime. Your payment may take us a few days to process. It is important to keep a positive balance in your students' accounts.
