News from the Math Interventionists

Math intervention groups are wrapping up for the year and Mrs. Fischer, Mr. McCarthy and Ms. Glyman would like to express how hard the students worked this year. They were so fun to work with and they all made some really good progress. It was a true pleasure to spend time with them each day.

Third grade students worked on everything from multi-digit addition and subtraction to beginning multiplication facts. They also used graphic organizers to solve some tricky word problems. They also really enjoyed some fluency activities like Target 20 and Target 100. We have had some epic games with the third graders this year and by the end of the year they were becoming very fluent with their facts and using great strategies to defeat the teachers.

Fourth grade students enjoyed some great fluency games as well. Draw 4 helped them multiply 2 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers. The fourth graders would arrange the numbers in order to make the largest product they could make. Students became experts at this game and also increased their efficiency with multiplication. Throughout the year the fourth graders worked on basic multiplication fact strategies, then moved on to some difficult problem solving strategies, and ended the year with multi-digit multiplication. They all worked so hard this year and we were so excited to see their progress.

The fifth grade had a favorite fluency game as well. Products Four in a Row was a classic activity that everyone enjoyed. Mr. McCarthy started the year undefeated and was very proud of himself for that, but as the year went on the fifth graders defeated him quite a bit. They were more than happy to celebrate in front of him and keep track of how many losses he was racking up. The fifth graders focused on lots of problem solving this year, especially two step problems. They also made excellent progress working with fractions and decimals. We will miss them next year as they move on to Tolland Middle School.

All math students could stay sharp this summer with any of these games or by practicing their addition and subtraction facts and their multiplication and division facts. Feeling fluent and efficient with facts is a great way to be ready to succeed in the fall. Have a wonderful summer and we look forward to seeing you next year!

END OF THE YEAR GRADE LEVEL WRAP-UPS

3RD GRADE

That's a wrap! We made it through another school year and third graders did it with smiles, enthusiasm, poise, and patience. All teachers and staff are so proud of these kids!

As we end the school year we can reflect on some great learning. We are finishing up our units in Fundations where students reviewed and learned new syllable types. They became experts at marking words and have a great new understanding of how the English language works. They are leaving with tools to spell words they know and brainstorm words they are unsure about. All third graders learned how to write in cursive, and we are practicing this as the school year ends.

In the Journeys program students read many fiction and non-fiction stories. They practiced skills such as story structure, making inferences, understanding author's purpose, story message, and explored fiction and nonfiction text features. Teachers want to encourage students to continue reading all summer and work on the Governor's Summer Reading Challenge. They will be receiving packets from their teachers with information on how to do this over the summer.

Math was an exciting year for our students as well. All third grade classes used the Bridges Math program and continued their routines from last year.. A huge hit was our Number Corner and most classes ended the year making up their own number cards to explore what they have learned all year. Students were very proud to be able to get the skills they need to be successful in multiplication and division. We worked on geometry, telling time, real-world word problems, fractions and had fun using Math Mysteries as a way of reviewing skills. One of the best ways to continue working over the summer is by practicing math facts. Students can still log into Reflex and IXL to practice their skills. We also encourage practicing math facts using the games they have learned in class. Flash cards, using money and cooking together as a family are also great ways to sharpen skills while having fun.

Tolland Green day was a huge success this year! We walked up to the Tolland Green to visit the Jail Museum and the Hicks-Stearns Museum. Third graders dressed up in 1800s clothing and participated in a One Room Schoolhouse demonstration, colonial games and lunch together as a class. This was such an exciting day for third graders and one that they will remember for years to come. We ended our Social Studies unit with a wonderful trip to Old Sturbridge Village. It was such a beautiful day and the kids had so much fun with their classmates.

Again, we would like to thank parents and families for all your support this year. We wish everyone a wonderful summer, filled with adventures with friends and family. Enjoy every minute and we can't wait to see your children thrive in fourth grade next year!

News from Student Services

REACH

Relationships Emotions Academic Career Help



REACH classes with Mrs. Bishopric, School Counselor, and Mr. Trane, School Counseling Intern, promote knowledge, attitudes, and skills through instruction in three content areas: academic achievement, career development, and personal/social growth. This year, we meet with all students approximately once per month in the specials rotation to deliver our lessons.

Third Grade

We have had an exciting end to the year in REACH! In March, our theme across grade levels was Careers. Third grade students had the opportunity to read a fun book called When I Grow Up, written by Al Yankovic. It is a fun, silly story about how we can grow up to be anything we want to be! Students then completed an activity where they learned about a type of career called a community helper and sorted a deck of cards matching certain tools with jobs.

In April, third grade students learned a bit about mental health using a book called Gizmo's Paw-some Guide to Mental Health. We talked about how sometimes we have big feelings, and it can be helpful to have strategies to manage those big feelings. Students then created an emotions strategy wheel, where they got to choose which strategies would be most helpful for them. We wrapped the year reflecting on obstacles we overcame and lessons we have learned!



Fourth Grade

During fourth grade REACH in March, we focused on the world of work and learning more about careers that we might want to pursue someday. Students had a chance to participate in a career exploration Game Show, where they learned about jobs in different clusters. We had a chance to draw careers that would use certain tools or act out different jobs. It was lots of fun! In April, fourth grade focused on teamwork. We watched a video about a team of men in China who had to work together to plant over 10,000 trees to enhance their village. Students then took on the challenge called Crossing the Toxic Swamp! Teams worked together to try to cross the classroom (or the "toxic swamp") using 5 pieces of paper as "floatation devices." Special rules made this challenge extra tricky, and teams really had to use communication skills and teamwork to complete the challenge!



Finally in May, we wrapped up the year talking about resilience. We watched a short video about a sweet little llama who faced a challenge. He had to show quite a bit of resilience to get to his end goal of reaching a special snack on the other side of a fence! We then did a resiliency challenge where students had to toss beads to a teammate and land them in a small cup. As each level was completed, the challenges became more difficult and our fourth graders really needed

to show resilience to keep going! We had a lot of fun in fourth grade this year!

Fifth Grade

During fifth grade REACH in March, our focus was on career exploration. Students not only had a chance to learn about careers within our REACH class, but they also had the opportunity to meet and talk with special parent visitors in lots of different career areas during our first-ever Fifth Grade Career Day! On this day, students were invited to walk around a "career fair" in our cafeteria and visit with various speakers across career fields. We had a master mechanic, a flight nurse, a police lieutenant, a physical therapist, a lawyer, a policy analyst and more! Students were sure to visit each station and ask questions. We even saw some live demonstrations and students were able to try out some medical equipment. It was a fantastic day!



To wrap up the year in fifth grade, in April, we presented a lesson on Cyber Bullying. Cyber bullying is just like regular bullying, but it happens through electronic technology. Students had the chance to watch videos of a story about a girl who was being picked on online and watched some positive solutions to get the bullying to stop. We then had a chance to practice what to do if you see or know about cyberbullying happening, and who are safe grownups to report to. Finally in May, fifth grade students had some time to reflect on our exciting year by playing an End of the Year Game Show! Teams worked together to complete challenges and earn points across several categories. We had some great conversations about what they are looking forward to, what they will miss the most, and acting out some funny memories from the year! It is hard to say goodbye to our fifth graders, but they will certainly rise to the challenge of sixth grade and beyond.




June – From the Reading Department

By becoming more familiar with language through reading, students build a rich vocabulary and an ability to express themselves clearly and creatively.



Reading builds better thinking strategies.

Analyzing words, sentences, themes and meaning; concentrating, conceptualizing and visualizing — all these elements of reading are strategies to expand a student's ability to think.



Reading is active and disciplined.

Students learn to choose what they read and when they read, and they learn to discipline themselves to concentrate on the written word.

What YOU Can Do to Encourage Reading



Use the library.

Getting a library card is 100% free and provides access to so many amazing print and electronic materials, as well as free or discounted museum passes and other services. Make sure everyone in your family has access to these great resources!



Read every day.

Make it a habit to set aside time each day for everyone to read—books, magazines, newspapers, letters. You can even begin by reading television listings, then discussing what you will watch together and why.



Talk about what you're reading.

Children need to see adults reading frequently. They also need to know the benefits of reading. Talk to your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, even young neighbors about what you're reading. Tell them how much you have enjoyed it, what you have learned, and how you have been inspired.



Ask about summer reading materials.

Schools and libraries often provide summer reading lists that highlight excellent books which are readily available, popular, and consistent with grade-level reading skills. Call your school or library for information.




Make reading materials part of your home.

<u>What:</u> Tolland Family Resource Center Camp Hawk offers a high quality and exciting summer program for children ages five through twelve. Children must be five by September 1, 2023.

Where: Tolland Intermediate School

<u>Dates:</u> The summer program will run from Monday, June 19, 2023, to Friday, August 25, 2023. (No camp on Tuesday, July 4, 2023, in observance of the Independence Day holiday.)

<u>Hours:</u> The camp is offered Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Extended care is available for an additional fee from 7:00 AM-9:00 AM and/or 4:00 PM-6:00 PM. The one fee covers both am and pm extended care.

Cost:

Full Week tuition is \$190.00 per week from 9:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Full Week extended care is an additional \$45.00 per week for AM and/or PM care.

For Camp Hawk 2023 the FRC will cover the fees for field trips and special activities.

Part Time Rate:

All children must enroll for a minimum of 2 days per week.

The part time rate is \$45.00 per day from 9:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Part time extended care is an additional \$15.00 per day for AM care and/or PM care. For Camp Hawk 2023 the FRC will cover the fees for field trips and special activities.

Registration: Registration begins March 1, 2023. The registration fee is \$50.00 per child or \$75.00 per family. A one-week security deposit is also due upon registration. You may register for as many weeks as you wish. Return completed registration forms to Tolland Family Resource Center, 247 Rhodes Road Tolland, CT 06084. Please make checks payable to the <u>Tolland Board of Education</u>.

General Expectations: For safety concerns, all campers are to follow Camp Hawk's expectations, guidelines, and policies as listed in our handbook. Handbooks will be available on our website by June 1, 2023. **Please make sure to read!**

Program Components:

Quality Staff: Our staff is experienced and qualified. Many of our staff work in the School Age Care Program, which provides continuity for the children. Staff members are first aid & CPR trained and medication certified.

<u>Meals</u>: Children need to bring their own lunch, a morning snack, an afternoon snack and a beverage in a self-cooled container. No microwave or refrigerator is available. Water is available for children throughout the day.

Theme Weeks: Each week has a fun theme! Children participate in planned activities geared toward the theme.

<u>Field Trips and Special Guests</u>: The children will have the opportunity to experience inhouse field trips/special guests as well as in person trips throughout the summer. The camp will take hiking trips.

<u>Inclement weather:</u> At times when the weather does not allow the children to go outside (i.e., extreme heat or rain), the staff will plan special activities for the children inside.

What to Bring: Please put your child's name on every item brought to camp. Each child must bring the following: backpack, change of clothes, bathing suit, towel, lunch, and snacks (in self-cooled container), water bottle, sunscreen, and insect repellant (left in their locker). Please apply sunscreen before arriving each day. Children may reapply their own sunscreen as needed.

It is a pleasure to have you join us at the Tolland Family Resource Center School Age Care Program (FRC SAC). The FRC staff members are CPR and first aid trained as well as medication certified. The program provides before and after school care at both Birch Grove Primary School and Tolland Intermediate School for children in kindergarten through grade six. Families that have children at both schools may choose to have their children attend the Tolland Intermediate School site in the morning and the Birch Grove site in the afternoon. Site location is determined by bussing availability. Children in 6th grade will be bussed to Tolland Intermediate School.

Policies and Procedures

Registration is not complete until the FRC receives the completed forms, registration fee and security deposit. You may email your completed registration forms to tollandfrc@tolland.k12.ct.us.

It is <u>especially important</u> for the FRC staff to know when your child will be absent from the School Age Care Program on a scheduled day. If you call or send a note to your child's teacher to report his/her absence or early dismissal from school, you must also notify the Family Resource Center by phone or email.
