Grade 3: The third graders will start a dinosaur unit to finish of the year with


Art. Students will create a 2D dinosaur egg that opens. After the eggs are done we will move on to making 3D air dry clay dinosaurs. When the dinosaurs finish drying we will be painting them and get them ready to take home. At the end of the unit we will be drawing and coloring our favorite dinosaurs.

Grade 4: Our fourth graders are busy during the month of May **making clay bowls** and glazing them. They should be ready to go home by the end of May. We will be starting up **Paper Robot designs** as we wait for our clay bowls to be fired.

Grade 5: The fifth graders will be taking home their Animal Wire Sculpture after grading this week. The students will be finishing up their Addition & Subtraction Relief Sculptures. These Relief projects be **Addition and Subtraction Clay Sculptures** will be 5-7 inches in size.. Students will select their own theme for this project. Some pieces of clay are added and some pieces are subtracted from the clay background. After being fired, the students will begin glazing their sculptures.

Mrs. Hill - Library Media

During the month of May all students will be finishing their Poetry Google Slideshow. This unit combines creative writing and teaches important technology skills. Students will write their own poems in a Google Slides, then use tools to change colors, fonts, and sizes; add pictures, resize and crop them; use the drawing tool to design shapes, color and layer them. Ms. Baker - General Music and Grade 5 Chorus



Grade 3 general music:

The third graders had a wonderful time on Tolland Green Day singing, listening to folk tales and learning about the musical instruments of colonial times. The third graders are continuing to learn how to read B, A, and G on the treble clef staff and play their recorders. They will continue with their recorder instruction in fourth

grade. In the coming weeks, the students will be learning more about the musical instrument families in order to choose which instrument they would like to play in the band. The THS band will be coming to TIS to perform for them. The students are also learning about what is involved in being in the fourth grade chorus. Students will be asked to sign up for band and chorus in September.

Grade 4 general music: The fourth graders are continuing their studies of the music, instruments, dances, games and songs of Asia. The students are learning more about the pentatonic scale on the xylophone too. We are strongly encouraging students to join the band and chorus in September, even if they have not participated in the past, all students are welcome. Music ensembles are a great opportunity for students to grow.

<u>Grade 5 general music:</u> The fifth graders learned so many new chords on the ukulele. Now the students are expanding their musical and scientific knowledge by creating musical inventions through Makey Makey. These hands-on projects are extremely exciting for the students.

<u>Grade 5 Chorus</u>: Grade 5 chorus will be performing at the promotion ceremony on the last day of school.

I am wishing all the fifth graders good luck at the middle school. I strongly encourage all of you to participate in the music program as you move up to TMS and beyond.



Mrs. Marchesani - Band and Chorus

Music Times Three: We enjoyed presenting a fun-filled Concert on May 3rd and we celebrated the joy of large group singing. Our Music Times Three Chorus was indeed large because there were 82 children on stage! Mx3 will be singing for our Birch Grove 2nd graders when they come to TIS in June for their tours. Looking ahead to next year, we have also talked about Band and Chorus options for 4th graders.

Grade 4 Band: Since our last update, the 4th grade Band presented their Spring Concert on May 9th. One highlight of the evening was a beginning band piece titled "Latin Magic". This piece is based on a Mexican folk melody which was used in the song "La Bamba". In preparation, students learned the theme contained in an 8 measure melody. Next, they had to tackle learning a full page band arrangement! To do this, students learned how to rest while other sections of the Band play and how to count the rests so they would be ready to play when indicated. Several instrument sections learned a harmony part which is completely different from the 8 measure melody. Listening skills were a must for this piece! The concept of "Coda" is also incorporated in "Latin Magic".

Grade 5 Band: We have talked about transitioning to 6th grade Band at TMS. It's that time of year already! I hope my students will continue playing at TMS in Band or choose the Band/Chorus option!

The 5th grade Band was invited to play "God Bless America" with the THS Band at the Memorial Day Parade Ceremonies held on May 28th. Seventeen 5th graders and two 4th graders will represent TIS by playing this advanced piece of music! This is our first year participating with the THS Band and we look forward to joining with them next year!

News from the Math Interventionists

Math intervention groups are wrapping up for the year and Mrs. Fischer, Mr. McCarthy and Ms. Glyman would like to express how hard the students worked this year. They were so fun to work with and they all made some really good progress. It was a true pleasure to spend time with them each day.

Third grade students worked on everything from multi-digit addition and subtraction to beginning multiplication facts. They also used graphic organizers to solve some tricky word problems. They also really enjoyed some fluency activities like Target 20 and Target 100. We have had some epic games with the third graders this year and by the end of the year they were becoming very fluent with their facts and using great strategies to defeat the teachers.

Fourth grade students enjoyed some great fluency games as well. Draw 4 helped them multiply 2 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers. The fourth graders would arrange the numbers in order to make the largest product they could make. Students became experts at this game and also increased their efficiency with multiplication. Throughout the year the fourth graders worked on basic multiplication fact strategies, then moved on to some difficult problem solving strategies, and ended the year with multi-digit multiplication. They all worked so hard this year and we were so excited to see their progress.

The fifth grade had a favorite fluency game as well. Products Four in a Row was a classic activity that everyone enjoyed. Mr. McCarthy started the year undefeated and was very proud of himself for that, but as the year went on the fifth graders defeated him quite a bit. They were more than happy to celebrate in front of him and keep track of how many losses he was racking up. The fifth graders focused on lots of problem solving this year, especially two step problems. They also made excellent progress working with fractions and decimals. We will miss them next year as they move on to Tolland Middle School.

All math students could stay sharp this summer with any of these games or by practicing their addition and subtraction facts and their multiplication and division facts. Feeling fluent and efficient with facts is a great way to be ready to succeed in the fall. Have a wonderful summer and we look forward to seeing you next year!








A reminder from the nurse:



<u>What:</u> Tolland Family Resource Center Camp Hawk offers a high quality and exciting summer program for children ages five through twelve. Children must be five by September 1, 2023.

Where: Tolland Intermediate School

Dates: The summer program will run from Monday, June 19, 2023, to Friday, August 25, 2023. (No camp on Tuesday, July 4, 2023, in observance of the Independence Day holiday.)

<u>Hours:</u> The camp is offered Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Extended care is available for an additional fee from 7:00 AM-9:00 AM and/or 4:00 PM-6:00 PM. The one fee covers both am and pm extended care.

Cost:

Full Week tuition is \$190.00 per week from 9:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Full Week extended care is an additional \$45.00 per week for AM and/or PM care.

For Camp Hawk 2023 the FRC will cover the fees for field trips and special activities.

Part Time Rate:

All children must enroll for a minimum of 2 days per week.

The part time rate is \$45.00 per day from 9:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Part time extended care is an additional \$15.00 per day for AM care and/or PM care. For Camp Hawk 2023 the FRC will cover the fees for field trips and special activities.

Registration: Registration begins March 1, 2023. The registration fee is \$50.00 per child or \$75.00 per family. A one-week security deposit is also due upon registration. You may register for as many weeks as you wish. Return completed registration forms to Tolland Family Resource Center, 247 Rhodes Road Tolland, CT 06084. Please make checks payable to the <u>Tolland Board of Education</u>.

General Expectations: For safety concerns, all campers are to follow Camp Hawk's expectations, guidelines, and policies as listed in our handbook. Handbooks will be available on our website by June 1, 2023. **Please make sure to read!**

Program Components:

Quality Staff: Our staff is experienced and qualified. Many of our staff work in the School Age Care Program, which provides continuity for the children. Staff members are first aid & CPR trained and medication certified.

<u>Meals</u>: Children need to bring their own lunch, a morning snack, an afternoon snack and a beverage in a self-cooled container. No microwave or refrigerator is available. Water is available for children throughout the day.

Theme Weeks: Each week has a fun theme! Children participate in planned activities geared toward the theme.

<u>Field Trips and Special Guests</u>: The children will have the opportunity to experience inhouse field trips/special guests as well as in person trips throughout the summer. The camp will take hiking trips.

<u>Inclement weather:</u> At times when the weather does not allow the children to go outside (i.e., extreme heat or rain), the staff will plan special activities for the children inside.

<u>What to Bring:</u> Please put your child's name on every item brought to camp. Each child must bring the following: backpack, change of clothes, bathing suit, towel, lunch, and snacks (in self-cooled container), water bottle, sunscreen, and insect repellant (left in their locker). Please apply sunscreen before arriving each day. Children may reapply their own sunscreen as needed.

It is a pleasure to have you join us at the Tolland Family Resource Center School Age Care Program (FRC SAC). The FRC staff members are CPR and first aid trained as well as medication certified. The program provides before and after school care at both Birch Grove Primary School and Tolland Intermediate School for children in kindergarten through grade six. Families that have children at both schools may choose to have their children attend the Tolland Intermediate School site in the morning and the Birch Grove site in the afternoon. Site location is determined by bussing availability. Children in 6th grade will be bussed to Tolland Intermediate School.

Policies and Procedures

Registration is not complete until the FRC receives the completed forms, registration fee and security deposit. You may email your completed registration forms to tollandfrc@tolland.k12.ct.us.

It is <u>especially important</u> for the FRC staff to know when your child will be absent from the School Age Care Program on a scheduled day. If you call or send a note to your child's teacher to report his/her absence or early dismissal from school, you must also notify the Family Resource Center by phone or email.

- * The program closes for all public school holidays, the winter break in December, and any closings due to inclement weather.

- * Should your childcare needs change and you would like to add additional days you must complete a Change in Registration Form. (Found on the website) Approval will be based on enrollment.
