

Unified Arts Update for November 2023

Art ~ Library ~ Music ~ Physical Education

Ms. Ballard - Art

Third graders students will begin exploring the **Elements of Art** called **Space and Color.** They will create a **Paper Weaving.** We will be using the Element of **Color** to decorate our fall weavings. Fall pictures will be added to the paper weaving as well as the colored strips of paper. We will also be talking about repeat **Patterns of Color** in our weavings. **No smock is needed this month.**

Fourth graders will be working on Fire Prevention Posters during the month of November. We will be using crayons, markers or colored pencils for this project. No smock is needed this month. Students will be given all rules and a folder for their art work. Take your time and do a job you're proud of! Good Luck to all!

Fifth graders will be finishing up their Marionette bodies by the tenth of November. We will be taking a short break from our puppet making to work on Fire

Prevention posters like the 4th graders.

Mrs. Hill - Library/Tech/STEM

Third grade: students will begin fiction genre studies at the intermediate school level. They will be learning about fantasy, mystery, historical fiction, science fiction, realistic fiction and traditional literature. Learning will be through a variety of methods, including: mini-movies from teachertube, powerpoint presentations, hands-on book sorting, genre bingo, Socrative reviews on the computer and interactive SmartBoard lessons. Third grade will also received the guidelines for the *voluntary* Library Book Challenges for this year. The library book challenges are based on reading from all different types of fiction genres.

Fourth grade and Fifth grade: have just finished reviewing nonfiction and students will now be moving on to nonfiction and reviewing the Dewey Decimal System. Fifth grade: just concluded a Library STEM Challenge in October to build a monster trap that did not hurt the monster. The students created some very interesting and innovative traps and demonstrated them to their classmates. Check out this short video clip from one STEM team. I will combine all of the videos taken for each STEM project by class. The iMovies



will then be uploaded to the class Library Google Classroom for viewing.



Fourth grade will show their STEM skills in the Library this month when they are challenged with **how to catch a turkey!**



Ms. Baker - Music & Chorus

<u>Grade 3 general music:</u> Third graders are learning to read and perform rhythms which contain eighth notes, quarter notes, quarter rests, and sixteenth notes, using boomwhackers and non-pitched percussion. The third graders are learning how to appropriately and respectfully sing their patriotic songs for our Veteran's Day assembly.

Grade 4 general music: The fourth graders just completed their studies of the music of Australia and are now working on the music of North America. Students learn about the music cultures, instruments and geography of this continent. The fourth graders are also learning to read and perform rhythms which contain eighth notes, quarter notes, quarter rests, and sixteenth notes, using boomwhackers and non-pitched percussion. They are learning how to appropriately and respectfully use a variety of musical instruments. They are also learning to sing their patriotic songs for our Veteran's Day assembly.

Grade 5 general music: The fifth graders are beginning their unit of study on music technology and composing and creating. They will compose and perform their own graphic notation pieces using vocal sounds and body percussion

as well as using our creativity boxes which are full of unique musical instruments. They have begun playing and learning about the ukuleles during their WIN block music time. Fun, Fun, Fun!! They are also learning to sing their patriotic songs for our Veteran's Day assembly.

Grade 4 Band: Band members have learned how to assemble, disassemble and clean their instruments safely. They are working hard to learn fingerings and proper embouchure (mouth position). It is so exciting to see and hear students enthusiastically learning how to play their instrument! Students have reviewed the values for whole and half notes and whole and half rests. Many Band students are already playing simple melodies such as "Hot Cross Buns" on their



instrument!

It is truly a joy to witness your children on their amazing journey of learning how to play an instrument solo and in small groups!

Grade 5 Band: All Band members are working hard to master melodies using the Concert Bb scale. Later on, we will add in Concert Eb and Concert F scales. Mike Hannickel's "Scale Preps for Beginning Band" helps Band students develop technique and listening skills. We use them for warm-ups and a fun way to start Band class. We are also reviewing counting and playing eighth notes using the Standard of Excellence Book 1 (the red book) # 46 "Jim Along Josie" and #51 "Skip It Lou", both pieces are American folk tunes. 

LOOK WHAT'S HAPPEING IN OUR CLASSROOMS



GRADE 3

We are moving right along with our curriculum in third grade. In the Journeys reading program, we have read stories like <u>Bat Loves the Night</u>, where we focused on sequence of events and action verbs. We also read a biography about Roberto Clement, where we focused on cause and effect, and literal and nonliteral meanings. Our grammar focuses are verb tenses, synonyms, and using commas. The stories we will read together as we move on will focus on drawing conclusions, context clues and more using commas. We have been mixing in narrative writing as we go. Students have the opportunity to write detailed narratives about their personal experiences.

In Fundations we are moving forward with Units 4 and 5. Third graders got experience using suffixes and marking up words that add extra consonants. We are still practicing sound alike words and connecting their new knowledge to their everyday writing. Oh course students have been excited to continue to learn cursive. We are still working on the lowercase letters.

In math, all third-grade students and teachers are working with the Bridges program. Classes are engaged in Unit 2, which is focusing on multiplication. We are looking at finding the area of arrays, using strategies that connect to multiplication. Students are encouraged to do repeated addition or use the multiplication facts that they know to figure out real word problems involving a pet shop, ocean animals, and window washing in a town. In Number Corner, our focus is arrays as well as fractions.

We have started our social studies unit which focuses on exploring Tolland in the 1700s. We were so lucky to be able to do self-guided tours of the Benton Homestead. Students learned what it was like to live in Tolland when families had to be self-sufficient. They learned about the jobs that children their age would have done on a farm. We also are trying to work on mapping skills to review things like global address, the continents, and learning more about looking at a map.

As always, we would like to thank families for their continued support.

GRADE 4

Fourth graders continue to demonstrate HAWK enthusiasm by participating in various spirit days held so far this year. The students were able to see the contributions of veterans through a whole school assembly on Friday, November 10th honoring those who serve, or have served, our country. Many students completed biographies of veterans in their own lives which are displayed in the school or made cards to be distributed by the American Red Cross as part of the Holiday Cards for Heroes program.

Math Number Corner activities include many hands-on tasks that focus on elapsed time and measurement. Students will measure and compare cups, quarts, and gallons. The Bridges in Mathematics Program continues to focus on multiplication and division strategies through direct instruction, problem strings, and Work Place activities.

In language arts we continue to work on close reading strategies to analyze texts. Some recent literary techniques have been identifying the use of allusion and hyperbole and focusing on how they add to the plot of the selection. Story structure, fact and opinion, conclusions and generalizations as well as author's purpose will be a focus.

The students completed their study of map skills and are beginning our first science unit, "Our Changing Earth." This unit focuses on weathering and erosion and their effect on the earth's landscape. At the end of the unit, students will apply their learning as they work to create a plan to slow erosion on hiking trails.

We hope that everyone continues to enjoy the fall weather and quality time spent with family and friends.

GRADE 5

In ELA, students are well into their first unit on Cultures in Conflict. This unit examines the cultural conflict between Native American and European American societies by asking students to consider how the beliefs and values of a culture, specifically the Nez Perce tribe, guide the actions of its people. So far, students have learned about Native Americans and the importance of natural resources and their homeland. Students continue to explore the impact of the United States' territorial growth through the eyes of the Nez Perce. They continue to examine the cultural conflict between Native American and European American societies by asking themselves how the beliefs and values of a culture, specifically the Nez Perce tribe, guide the actions of its people.

Students have been practicing their writing skills through written summaries which include a topic sentence, text evidence, elaboration and a conclusion sentence. We are preparing to write a compare and contrast essay on two of the main characters from, Thunder Rolling in the Mountains, by Scott O'Dell and Elizabeth Hall.

In Social Studies, students have learned what life was like for indigenous people and how they used their natural resources to sustain their lifestyle. Currently, our Social Studies and ELA topics align, and we are learning how the relationship between the Europeans and indigenous people reveals differing beliefs and values of each group. Students are also learning reasons for European exploration and the conflicts the Europeans had with the Native Americans. Students are learning about the Vikings, Marco Polo, Christopher Columbus, and other early explorers.

In Math, students have been learning about adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers. We learned about strategies using clocks, money, number lines, and the least common denominator. Students have applied these skills to word problems and ratio tables. They are also very excited about learning new workplace games such as Target Practice and Racing Fractions.

In Number Corner, students have been collecting a meter a day and converting our totals into other metric units on our Calendar Collector chart. They have also been classifying triangles every day in our Calendar Grid and discussing transformation such as reflections, rotations, and translations. Students should continue to use Reflex and IXL in school and at home.

In Science, students have been loving the Earth, Moon, and Sun unit. We learn about patterns such as day/night, seasons, moon phases, and shadows. This unit will wrap up in December and the 5th grade scientists will get ready to start a unit on Habitats. It is always one of the favorite science units.



School Meals 2023-2024:

All students are eligible for a free breakfast each day. Students who qualify for free or *reduced-price meals* will also be eligible to receive one free lunch daily. ALL OTHER LUNCHES WILL BE CHARGED AT THE CURRENT LUNCH PRICE PER SCHOOL.

Payment for these lunches is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The district participates in the National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program which offers students nutritionally balanced meals daily. The lunch period is 30 minutes. Proper manners are always expected in the cafeteria. Free and reducedprice meals are available based on financial need. Information on this program may be obtained from the main office or Abby Kassman-Harned, the Food Service Director, at aharned@tolland.k12.ct.us or 870-6854.

We use a Point-of-Sale System that allows you to put money into an account for your child to purchase meals.

Scanning – All students will be scanned unless the parent or guardian opts out of this biometric identification procedure. When your child comes through the service line, he/she will scan his/her finger as a means of identification.

Payments – The cost of lunch at Birch Grove and Tolland Intermediate school is \$3.15. One school breakfast is free for all students. One milk is provided for each lunch and breakfast. Ala carte milk is \$0.75. You may sign up for "My School Account" and make your payments online. Your child may give payment along with a form to his/her classroom teacher to send to the office, or he/she may bring payment directly to the cashier in the cafeteria at mealtime. Your payment may take us a few days to process. It is important to keep a positive balance in your students' accounts.
